❖ **Instructions for Selected Candidates for BAMS 2024 Counseling and Physical Reporting at the Institute :**

- All selected candidates must bring the original documents (along with two sets of attested photocopies) required at the time of joining the National Institute of Ayurveda, Deemed to be University, Jaipur.
- **The following documents are required :-**
  1. Provisional Allotment Letter generated online from the AACCC portal.
  2. Admit Card for the NEET (UG)-2024 Exam issued by NTA.
  3. NEET (UG)-2024 re-revised score card issued by NTA on 26.07.2024
  4. Date of Birth Certificate (if the 10th Standard Certificate does not bear the same)
  5. Class 10th Pass Certificate and Marks sheet
  6. Class 12th Pass Certificate and Marks sheet
  7. Proof of identity (Aadhar/PAN card/Driving License/Voter ID/ Passport).
  8. Transfer Certificate & Character Certificate from the last studied institution.
  9. Migration Certificate.
  10. Domicile Certificate.
  11. Medical Fitness Certificate issued by Registered Medical Practitioner in the prescribed format as attached in **Annexure-VI**.
  12. Eight (8) Passport size photographs. (Same as affixed on the NEET (UG)- 2024/AACCC-UG counseling-2024 online application form).
  13. The candidate should also bring the category certificate in the prescribed format on <https://aaccc.gov.in/information-bulletin-ug/> also attached in annexures, if applicable :-
    - a) Disability Certificate issued by a duly constituted and authorized Medical Board for 21 Benchmark Disabilities as per the Rights of Persons with Disability Act, 2016, will be accepted. Further, the authorized designated disability centres will issue the online generated PwBD Certificate from the MCC portal, and the format of the same is annexed in ANNEXURE-I. No other PwBD certificate issued by any other Authorities/ Hospital will be considered for admission. (The qualified candidates with Benchmark Disability (PwBD)- should get themselves certified at one of the Disability Assessment Boards, constituted in various States/UTs. The list of Authorized designated Centers that will issue Disability Certificates as per 21 Benchmark Disabilities given under RPwD Act 2016 is attached as **ANNEXURE-II**.

- b) The SC/ST Certificate issued by the competent authority should be in English or Hindi. Sub-caste should be mentioned in the certificate and tally with the respective central list of corresponding states published by the Government of India. The certificate should be as per the prescribed format of the Government of India **(ANNEXURE-III)**.
- c) OBC-NCL certificate issued by the Competent Authority (issued on or after 1 April 2024) as per the prescribed format of the Government of India. The OBC-NCL certificate format is attached as **ANNEXURE-IV**.
- d) Economically Weaker Section (GEN-EWS) certificate issued on or after 1 April 2024 by the Competent Authority. **(ANNEXURE-V)**.

14. **Important Note :-** Candidate should have completed 17 years of age at the time of admission or will complete that age on or before 31st December of the year of his/her admission to the first year of the BAMS Course is eligible for admission.

- Accordingly, the lower age limit shall be as under :

For Candidates of General (UR)/General-EWS	Born on or before 31.12.2007
For Candidates of SC/ST/OBC-NCL/PwBD Category	

- There is no upper age limit for admission in the BAMS Course.


Sir,

In view of the above, all designated disability centres are requested to examine and provide Disability certificates to candidates seeking admission in AIQ seats of Ayurveda/ Siddha/ Unani/ Homeopathy (ASU&H) for both UG & PG Courses for the current academic year along with Medical & Dental candidates.

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### Appendix "A"

[See regulation 5 (4)]

SCHEDULE relating to "SPECIFIED DISABILITY" referred to in clause (zc) of section 2 of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), provides as under:-

#### 1. Physical disability-

(A) Loco motor disability (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including-

- (a) "Leprosy cured person" means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from-
- (i) Loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity.
- (ii) Manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity.

(iii) Extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall construed accordingly.

(b) "Cerebral palsy" means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth.

(c) "Dwarfism" means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimetres) or less.

(d) "Muscular dystrophy" means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for health muscular. It is characterized by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue.

(e) "acid attack victims" means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

#### (B) Visual impairment-

(a) "blindness" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction-

- (i) Total absence of sight, or
- (ii) Visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction, or
- (iii) Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.

(b) "Low-vision" means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:-

- (i) Visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 upto 3/60 or upto 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
- (ii) Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

#### (C) Hearing impairment-

(a) "Deaf" means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears;

(b) "Hard of hearing" means person having 60 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ear.

(D) "Speech and language disability" means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

2. Intellectual disability a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in a dative behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including-

(a) "Specific learning disabilities" means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read, write, spell, or to do mathematic calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia.

(b) "Autism spectrum disorder" means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

3. Mental behaviour- "means illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviours, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person.

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4. Disability caused due to-

(a) Chronic neurological conditions, such as-

(i) "Multiple sclerosis" means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelination and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other.

(ii) "Parkinson's disease" means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

(b) Blood disorder-

(i) "Haemophilia" means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterised by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding.

(ii) "Thalassemia" means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of haemoglobin.

(iii) "Sickle cell disease" means a haemolytic disorder characterised by chronic anaemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage, "Haemolytic" refers to the destruction of cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of haemoglobin.

5. Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

6. Any other category as may be notified by the Central Government from time to time.

**Appendix "B"**

[See regulation 5 (4)]

**Guidelines regarding admission of students, with "Specified Disabilities" under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016), in B.A.M.S.**

1. The "Certificate of Disability" shall be issued in accordance with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017, published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, Part II, Section 3, Sub-section (i), vide number G.S.R. 591 (E), dated the 15th June, 2017.
2. The extent of "specified disability" in a person shall be assessed in accordance with the "guidelines for the purpose of assessing the extent of specified disability in a person included under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016)", published in the Gazette of India, Extraordinary, Part II, section 3, Sub-section (ii), vide number S.O. 76 (E), dated the 4th January, 2018.
3. The minimum degree of disability should be 40% (Benchmark Disability) in order to be eligible for availing reservation for persons with specified disability.
4. The term 'Persons with Disabilities' (PwD) is to be used instead of the term 'Physically Handicapped' (PH)
