Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provisions of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government notified that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. In view of the above the Central Government constituted the Autonomous Boards with effect from 11th June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

2. However, GOI, Ministry of AYUSH vide its letter no. L.14011/3/2020-EP (1) dated 26.03.2021 and 15.04.2021 issued Relaxation/support policy for ASU&S colleges in unprecedented times of COVID-19 pandemic for the academic session

- (i) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of Infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
  - (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto; and
  - (iv) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 for grant of permission to PG courses.
8. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2022-23.

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's letter No. L-14014/366/2019-EP(1) dated 18.06.2019 related to admission matter for the academic year 2019-20 intimating certain requirements to be fulfilled by the college for consideration of permission for the academic session 2020-21.

2. Further, refer to the CCIM's letter No.Ref.26-46/2020-College dated 23.10.2020 forwarding therewith recommendation of the college to the Central Government based on thorough examination of the visitation report Part-I, indemnity bond, affidavit & latest details of teaching, non-teaching and hospital staff submitted by the college along with the assessment report, as the physical verification by conduction of inspection could not be carried out in view of present COVID-19 pandemic situation for the A.Y. 2020-21. On examining the same in terms of Regulation 3 of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016”, Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder, it is found that the College is fulfilling notified and approved criterion for granting Conditional Permission for UG (BAMS) course and 14 PG Courses.

3. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to grant Conditional Permission to National Institute of Ayurveda, Madhav Vilas Palace, Amer Road, Jaipur-302002, Rajasthan for conducting 125 seats (including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 130 seats (including EWS) in 14 PG courses namely (1) Ayurveda Siddhant- 10 Seats (including EWS), (2) Rasashstra & Bhaishajya Kalpana- 10 Seats (including EWS), (3) Kaumarbhritya- 08 Seats (including EWS), (4) Panchakrma- 08 Seats (including EWS), (5) shalakya Tantra- 08 Seats (including EWS), (6) Rachana Sharir- 09 Seats (including EWS), (7) Kriya Sahrir- 10 Seats (including EWS), (8) Dravyaguna Vigyana- 11 Seats (including EWS), (9) Kayachikitsa- 11 Seats (including EWS), (10) Swasthavritta & yoga- 09 Seats (including EWS), (11) Roganidan avum Vikriti Vigyan- 11 Seats (including EWS), (12) Shalya Tantra- 09 Seats (including EWS), (13) Prasuti & Striroga- 09 Seats (including EWS) and (14) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidyaka- 07 Seats (including EWS) for the academic session 2020-21 under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970.

4. It is further informed that the counseling for seats under all India quotas shall be conducted by the Central government and counseling for the remaining seats shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State. If any seats are not filled up in the central counseling, the same shall be transferred to the said Counseling Authority to admit students as per their rules/reservation policies/norms. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the Central counseling for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made thereunder.

6. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of CCIM and the Central Government.

7. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2020 to get permission for the session 2021-22:

- (i) all the Requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
- (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*; and
- (iv) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 for grant of permission to PG courses.

8. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to CCIM under intimation to this Ministry. The CCIM will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled by means of an inspection and submit a report along with its assessment in this matter to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2021-22.


2 The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 10-11.04.2019 to assess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance submitted by the college and forwarded its recommendations and report to the Ministry. On examining the same, it was observed that the said college is not fulfilling all the norms of notified Regulations for granting permission for a period of five years (100% criteria). However, the said college is fulfilling all the norms for granting conditional permission (permission for a period of one year) for the academic year 2019-20, as per sub-regulation (3) of Regulation 3 of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals and Post Graduate Ayurveda Medical Education) Regulations, 2016”, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made there under and as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs).



**Sub:** Grant of permission for a period not exceeding 05 years to the National Institute of Ayurveda, Japiur, Rajasthan for 92 seats in UG (BAMS) course 104 seats in 14 PG courses namely (i) Ayurveda Siddhant (8 seats), (ii) Rasashastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana (9 seats), (iii) Kaumarbhritya (7 seats), (iv) Panchakarma (7 seats), (v) Shalaky Tantra (6 seats) (vi) Rachana Sharir (7 seats) (vii) Kriya Sharir (8 seats), (viii) Dravyaguna Vigyana (8 seats), (ix) Kayachikitsa (9 seats), (x) Swasthavritta & Yoga (7 seats), (xi) Roganida: ayum Vikriti Vigyan (8 seats), (xii) Shalya Tantra (7 seats), (xiii) Prasuti & Striroga (7 seats) and (xiv) Agadtantra ayum Vidhi Vaidyaka (6 seats) under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 from the academic session 2016-17 to the academic sessions 2020-21- reg.

Sir,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's order No. R.17011/184/2015-EP (IM-1) dated 15.10.2015 related to admission matter for the year 2015-16 intimating certain shortcomings for rectification for consideration of the case for the 2016-17 session.

2. The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 24.02.2016 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance submitted by the college and forwarded its recommendations and report to this Ministry. On examining the same, it was observed that the required number of Higher Faculty, distribution of faculty in department, required 1HF + 1L in addition to the UG requirement in the departments of Shalaky Tantra, required Clinical Registrars in Hospital etc. are not available as per MSR. Therefore, an opportunity of hearing was given to the college on 29.09.2016 to present the case.

3. The Observation of Hearing Committee based on the submissions made by the college during hearing and the recommendations & visitation report of the CCIM have been carefully examined in terms of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approval of the Hon'ble MoS (IC) for the UG/PG course(s) for grant of conditional permission for the academic session 2016-17 vide Ministry letters No.R.11011/01/2016-EP (IM-1) dated 12.08.2016 & 31.08.2016 (available at Ministry's website <indianmedicine.nic.in>) and it is found that the College is fulfilling the notified and approved criteria as follows:-

(i) Teachers:

- a. For UG course: 100% eligible teachers, 47 Higher Faculties (Professor/Reader) in 14 Departments in the college, 1P + 1R + 1 L in each of 14 Dept. & 1L of Prasuti + 1L of Kayachikitsa + 1L of Sanskrit after considering the process initiated for recruitment of Professors & Associate Professors for 61-100 UG seats and 09 part time teachers;
- b. For PG course(s): In addition to the UG course, 1 Higher Faculty + 1 Lecturer in the concerned PG department, fulfillment of teacher-student ratio (1:3 for Professor, 1:2 for Reader and 1:1 for Lecturer);

(ii) Beds in hospital:

- a. Minimum 100 beds in hospital of college for 61-100 UG seats;
- b. Minimum 100 bedded hospital for PG Colleges of Ayurveda and additional beds in 1:4 student-bed ratio for each PG clinical seat over the total requirement of beds for UG students intake capacity;

(iii) Minimum 200 patients per day in OPD during the year 2015 for 61-100 UG seats:(iv) 40% bed occupancy for UG College and 50% for Colleges with PG course/s in IPD during the year 2015:(v) Equipment and instruments: Minimum 90% of required equipment as specified under the schedule VII of MSR; and(vi) Fulfillment of provisions including staff requirement under relevant PG Education Regulations.(vii) Other infrastructure and staff required as per the MSR Regulations of 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013, in addition to above requirements for grant of permission for a period not exceeding five years.

4. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to *grant permission* under section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970 *for a period not exceeding five years* to National Institute of Ayurveda, Jaipur, Rajasthan for 92 seats in UG (BAMS) course 104 seats in 14 PG courses namely (i) Ayurveda Siddhant (8 seats), (ii) Rasashastra & Bhaishajya Kalpana (9 seats), (iii) Kaumarohritya (7 seats), (iv) Panchakarma (7 seats), (v) Shalakyia Tantra (6 seats) (vi) Rachana Sharir (7 seats) (vii) Kriya Sharir (8 seats), (viii) Dravyaguna Vigyana (8 seats), (ix) Kayachikitsa (9 seats), (x) Swasthavritta & Yoga (7 seats), (xi) Roganidan ayum Vikriti Vigyan (8 seats), (xii) Shalya Tantra (7 seats), (xiii) Prasuti & Stiroga (7 seats) and (xiv) Agadtantra ayum Vidhi Vaidyaka (6 seats) (the seats in said PG courses will be subjected to the availability of eligible PG teachers for PG in concerned department as per PG regulations) from the academic session 2016-17 to the academic session 2020-21 with following instructions:

- i. That the college shall appoint teachers and hospital staff as committed during the hearing;
- ii. that the college shall obtain the NABH accreditation for the Hospital within one year and the NAAC accreditation for the College within two years from the issuance of the permission letter and the college shall submit its compliance to this Ministry as well as to the CCIM within specified period, failing which the permission granted for a period not exceeding 5 years shall deem to be withdrawn; and
- iii. that as specified in Sub-Regulation (2) of Regulation 3 of the Regulations namely the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations of 2013 ".....during which the college shall not be inspected, except for random checks on receipt of any complaint, or otherwise as deemed necessary either by the Central Government or by the Central Council of Indian Medicine. The Central Council shall visit the college *suo moto* three months before the expiry of permission".

5. The college shall maintain all the Requirements of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standard Requirements of Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2012 read with amendment Regulations, 2013, provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder *in toto* during the period of permission (i.e. up to 2020-21). As per the provisions of Sub-Regulation (2) of Regulation 3 of the MSR Regulations, 2012, the Central Council shall visit the college *suo moto* three months before the expiry of permission to verify the requisite infrastructure and facilities required under above mentioned Regulations by means of an inspection and shall submit a report to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2021-22.
